Participants: The purpose of this scavenger hunt is to familiarize you with the places, resources and services found at the Jack Patrick Information Technology Center, BLDG 1000. To complete these tasks, you will have to go to the library as well as use the computers in the library.

Please do not ask the library staff for the answers! They will instruct you in finding the answers. Do *your* best!

1. Where is the library catalog located in the library?	
2. What food is pictured on the cover of the most recent copy of the magazine <i>Bon Appétit</i> ?	
3. Where are the research computers located in the library? (On what level?)	
4. Where in the ITC would you go to type a paper or take an online test? (On what level?)	
5. Find a DVD on the shelf in the library. What is the title and call number of this DVD?	
6. Where exactly are the "library reserves" located in the library?	
7. How much does it cost to make a photocopy in the library? To print? To print in color?	
8. How many study rooms are on the upper level of the ITC? Can you have food or drinks in the study rooms?	
9. What kind of identification do you need to check out library materials?	
10. Where would you find this book: E185.97.R63 B76 1996 1? (On what level?)	

Using a research computer in the library, answer the following questions:

1. Write down the URL (web address) of the library website's front page.
2. From a link on the library website's front page, find the name of the Director of Library Services and one other library staff member and write them down.
3. Access the GALILEO databases on the library website's front page. List the two ways GALILEO offers you to BROWSE.
4. What is currently "in the spotlight" on the GALILEO website's front page?
5. List two subjects under the "Science and Technology" link on GALILEO website's front page.
6. When doing a search for Biography (under the History link), what 5 databases does GALILEO recommend you search in? Hint: scroll to the bottom of the search page.
7. From the front page of GALILEO's website, click the tab that just says "Search." Do a keyword search of your own last name. Write down the title and author of one article that is written by or about someone with your same last name.
8. Under the Education link on GALILEO website's front page, select Career and Technical Education. Do a keyword search of that subject for your own course of study. Select an interesting article from what is returned and write down the title and author of that article.
9. Where can you find a link to search the electronic version of the Augusta Chronicle?
10. Using the library catalog, find a fiction book you would like to read. Write down the title, author and call number. Find this book on the shelf. Is it a paperback or hardback book?
