$>$ Retaking Courses: Students can retake a class to earn a higher grade. The highest grade will be used for ranking purposes.
$>$ Information Sessions: Students will be REQUIRED to attend an informational session during the semester that the ranking application is open for acceptance into competitive admissions program (i.e. If a student is applying for admission during the Fall cohort, attendance to an information session would be required during the Spring semester when ranking applications are open).
