POLICY:

Certain occupational areas require skills or competency mastery that can best be obtained or demonstrated in a laboratory environment with tangible items or projects. For example, a laboratory environment introduces the "customer dimension" into personal service occupations such as cosmetology and provides real-world working conditions to such industrial and technical occupations as auto mechanics, auto body repair, welding, building construction, and others. When carefully managed and controlled, Instructional Live Work Projects provide a needed dimension to laboratory learning for specific occupations as a planned and integrated curriculum component.
