Augusta Technical College's Cybersecurity Program was recently recognized by Newsweek Magazine as one of the *Leading Cybersecurity Programs in the Nation in 2021*.

Augusta Tech's School of Cyber and Digital Media

Cybersecurity Associate of Applied Science (AAS) Degree program provides students with hands-on technical training in the concepts, principles, and techniques required to successfully prevent and/or mitigate security issues on computing devices in a networked environment. Both security theory and hands-on practice are stressed. The bulk of the college's cyber and IT-related courses are held at the **Georgia Cyber Center** in downtown Augusta.

Economic Impact



Augusta Technical College recently had an economic impact study completed by **Dr. Greg George**, Director of the Center for Economic Analysis at **Middle Georgia State University's School of Business**. The economic impacts calculated are those derived solely from the

operations of the College and do not include the related impacts derived from the past and future (past five-year totals) activity of the graduates (increased employment and earnings), or new businesses attracted to the region as a result of the enhanced workforce.

Per the report, Augusta Technical College generates **\$58,655,563** of annual

economic activity (in the current year), and an estimated **\$320,609,344** over the next five years after adjusting for inflation. Each year, Augusta Technical College directly employs **399** employees, generating **\$24,500,000** in direct household earnings and supports an additional **115** jobs in the local economy totaling **514** in total regional jobs impact. Additionally, Augusta Technical College enhances regional household earnings by **\$32,482,100** because of its presence. Over a five-year timeframe, total household earnings in the region are increased by **\$169,038,153** because of Augusta Technical College's operations.

Augusta Technical College is honored to support our veterans and continue our

partnership with <u>**The Warrior Alliance**</u>, an organization whose mission is to help Warriors and their families achieve a fulfilling civilian life by promoting collaboration between the organizations that can support them during the transition from military service. The college and the organization were recently mentioned in the *Golf Digest* magazine.

Vets in the program—called **Operation Double Eagle**—spend mornings learning topics such as horticultural science, pesticide management and irrigation in classrooms at **Augusta Technical College**. Then in the afternoon, they go apply their new knowledge at the modest hole at the golf club. After nine weeks, graduates of the program have a **Golf Turf and Landscape Specialist certificate** and, possibly, a new direction and purpose.

Conducted at Augusta Technical College and led by Golf Course Management Instructor <u>Alan Manley</u> and retired Horticulture instructor <u>Scott Smith</u>, the 14-credit hour program dives into turf grass and golf course management, irrigation and pipe installation, pest management and pesticide application, water management, horticulture science, equipment safety, planting and legal — along with daily lab visits to the Double Eagle Performance Center located at the **Augusta Municipal Golf Club**, affectionately referred to as *The Patch*.
