

High School Equivalency (HSE) Testing Options







More options to earn your high school equivalency in Georgia.





Computer-based format

In-person and at-home testing available

Can take one subject at a time

English or Spanish language

5 Subjects:

Language Arts - Reading (65 mins) Language Arts - Writing (120 min) Mathematics (90min) Science (80 min) Social Studies (70 min)

Test Format: Multiple choice questions with written essy.

4 Subjects:

Reasoning through Language Arts (150 min) Mathematical Reasoning (115 min) Science (90 min) Social Studies (70 min)

Test Format: Multiple choice questions, drag and drop, fill in the blank, drop down, and written essy.

Passing Score: Earn a scale score of 8-outof-20 on each of the five subtests, score 2-out-of-6 on the essay, and schieve a total scale score of 45. All subtests must be in the same language.

Retests: HiSET® candidates may take each subject area test three times within a calendar year. Candidates must wait 14 days between test results. The two retests per subject area are \$16 each if taken within one calendar year and \$25.50 for each proctored HiSET@Home Retest.

Full Battery Fee: \$133.75 Subject area tests: \$26.75 each

Two retests per subject area: \$16 each HiSET@Home: \$36.25 per subject Full Battery Online: \$181.25

Passing Score: 145 minimum standard score of a possible 200 on each of the four subtests. All subtests must be in the same language.

Retests: GED® candidates may take each subject area test three times without any waiting period. After the third attempt, candidates must wait 60 days before they can test again. The first two retest are \$20 if taken within one calendar year. Any additional retests will be \$40. All Online Proctored GED® Tests are \$40 per subject area.

Full Battery Fee: \$160

Subject area tests: \$40 each

Three retests per subject area: \$20 each Online Proctored GED Test: \$40 per subject

Full Battery Online: \$160

Testing Scholarships Available

Accomodations: If you have disability or health-related needs, you must submit a request for accomodations prior to scheduling your test appointment. For more information, visit hiset.ets.org/requirements/disabilities or ged.com/about_test/accomodations. Paper-based testing is available as an accomodation for both tests.

Individuals are eligible to test in Georgia if they:

- · Are at least 16 years of age (16 and 17 year-olds must enroll in a state-approved adult education program
- and receive approval to test). For more information, visit tcsg.edu/adult-education. Have not graduated from or are currently enrolled in an accredited high school.
- · Can provide a valid photo ID (driver's license, state identification card, military ID, or passport).
